The second is the past participle, corresponding with the perfect and pluperfect of the Latin. 153. The first evidently consists of the I. preterit (aorist) tense and the particle ti affixed, the persons of this tense remaining entirely unchanged; except that in the i pers. sing. the personal pronoun ani, I, is appended, whereby the t in ti is lost; thus ademe-t(i)-ani becomes ademetani. 154. Great care, however, must be taken with these participial forms, not to mistake...



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
